Gauchos Grids Tackle Dorsey High Tomorrow In 'Practice Scrimmage'

Head Coach Sheldon Loughborough will unveil his 1947 Narbonne football machine all decked out in a new Fall formation against reputedly strong Dorsey High Friday on the Gauchos' turf.

A beefy Narbonne eleven, averaging slightly more than 178 pounds per player, will take the field initially at 2:30 to engage the uptowners in what is known throughout the L. A. city school system as a "practice scrimmage."

Loughborough named the following as starters on the basis of a rough scrimmage held Friday: left end, Jack Garrabrant; left tackle, Ralph Collins; left guard, Ed Hansen; center, Jack Allen; right guard; Ray Hutson; right tackle, Bob Scales; right end, Duane Parsons; quarterback, Bill Kelley; left half, Corky Richardson; right half, Bill Biller; and fullback, all-Marine League sophomore Bill Stits.

Under L. A. city school rules a "practice scrimmage" means exactly what it says—no kick offs, no time keeping, no yardage records, no officials. Each team will be allowed eight downs at midfield. There will be unlimited substitution and "mass participation" is encouraged.

Expected to see early action in the practice fray are: ends Lawrence Jordan, Bob LaFlamme, Andy Spaan and Lowell Summerford; tackles Dick Hamilton and Don Rice; guard Forrest Bell; center Alfred Dudley; quarter Jack Sonnichsen; halfbacks, Gary Phillips and William Meng; and fullback Alto Giacopuzzi.

Loughborough's starting line, aided by 220-pound former fullback Hansen, now a guard, will average 179 pounds plus per man; the backfield, ably abetted by 210-pound quarter Kelley, formerly a tackle, will tip 'em at 178 pounds per player.

A mild surprise to uninitiateds was the nomination of Garrabrant, sporting zero in the experience column, at left end. Garrabrant, a 165-lb., A-12, will snag serials at the port end spot and pass 'em from the key fullback spot, alternately, of course. According to Loughborough, Garrabrant's rapid growth between sophomore and junior years kept him from trying out for football. He is a star trackman.

Parsons, also an A-12, weighing 180, will take care of the starboard wing initially. Parsons was a varsity 2nd-stringer last season.

Collins, an A-12 and the heaviest man on the starting eleven at 220, was 1st string varsity tackle last year. Scales, a 175-lb. B-12, was a varsity second teamer in 1946.

For the pivot post, Loughborough picked Jack Allen, a 163-lb., A-12, a lightweight last season over Alfred Dudley, varsity second-stringer in 1946.

Kelley, 210-pound A-12 quarter back, made last year's 1st string at tackle. Former B Jack Sonnichsen, who was knocked temporarily out of his head in Friday's scrim, is giving Kelley a run for the starting post.

Left half, Richardson, an A-12, tips the scales at 165 pounds. He was a varsity first-stringer last year. His starting running mate Bill Biller, at right half, is an A-12 and weighs 150. Biller was also a varsity starter in 1946.

Fullback Stits made the all-Marine loop eleven last season as an A-9. He weighs 180 pounds and will take care of most of the passing.

The fullback, under Loughborough's new short punt, spread end, single wing offense is in the tailback spot, doing most of the ball packing.

Understudying Stits at the key position will be Garrabrant, moving back from end, and Giacopuzzi, a former B teamer.

All the backs will heave the pigskin, says Loughborough with most of the chucking falling to the aforementioned fullbacks.

Dale Atkeson, an A-10 with no previous experience, has been the best punter in early practice sessions. Atkeson was recently shifted from end to fullback. End George Foster is also handy in the kicking department as kick off man.

First string guard Ed Hansen is in line for the place-kicking assignment.

Loughborough broke out the crying towel again Friday to go with his impression of the first Narbonne intrasquad scrimmage of the season from which halfback Richardson emerged with a temporary shoulder ailment.

"Passing was very inaccurate and the tackles looked weak" was the mentor's comment. However, he did have a good word for end Gregory Biller's reception of the aerial efforts.

Loughborough's new formation will feature plenty of passing both of the forward and of the lateral variety.

The offense features split ends and a balanced line on every play with the right half as a wingback five-yard outside the end. Most successful exponent of the formation at present is the San Diego Bombers, a pro outfit.

First full-length regulation contest for the Gauchos is set for Thursday afternoon Oct. 9 on the Narbonne field. It is a practice non-league engagement with powerful Washington High and will start about 2:30.

On Oct. 16, the Gauchos journey to Wilmington to meet Phineas T. Banning High in the first Marine loop tilt.

The initial home league tussle for the Narbonnites is scheduled for Oct. 23 with Gardens Early Marine loop favorite, as guest.

Both teams are entered in the Southern California Touch Football association with league play starting next Sunday.

The Torrance high school B's open their eight-game schedule against the Redondo Beachawks at 2:30 p.m. today in the Redondo Bowl.

Coach Cliff Greybehl has worked his squad from the single wing formation and feels that the boys are in top shape for their game.

Topping the practice schedule was a full-length game against the varsity third team last week, which the B's lost 13-2. Greybehl has spent the time since that game working the rough spots out of his squad and the B's are rarin' to go.

Leading the B offense is Dick Cloward, a pile-driving fullback who is a good bet for the varsity next year. Greybehl has planned the team's attack around Cloward and Bob Snuffer, a returning B letterman at left half.
