(Continued from Page 1-A) Angeles runs and for a "three-for-a-quarter" token on local runs.

W. H. Murphey, bus manager, said that the new runs will be installed as soon as equipment which can maintain the service is on hand, and factory representatives were enthusiastic about the early date contemplated for delivery of the new equipment.

The whole local transportation problem should be solved within the next few months, it was said.

The program adopted by the City Council Tuesday night was recommended by the sub-committee of the Citizens Committee on City Charter amendments which found that if new equipment is obtained, maintenance costs of the bus lines will be reduced to a minimum, and that if fares are adjusted and new lines instituted, revenue will be sufficient to procure four new buses without actually obligating the general fund of the city.

Members of the committee which submitted the report are Councilman W. H. Tolson, chairman; Wm. Zoeller, William Murphey, E. W. Ingram, Dean Sears, Bob Haggard and Frank S. Selover.

30 Birthday Party Celebrants Lose \$5000 In Robbery

City Provides Grid Buses


