The double-ring ceremony was performed by candlelight by the Rev. Lester B. Wiley. In honor of Pearl Harbor, the bridegroom, best man and ushers, all veterans of active combat, wore their full dress army and navy uniforms. The bride, gowned in white crepe sufficed with gold sequins, was given away by her father. Her gown had a high heart-shaped neckline and her coronet veil came to shoulder length. She carried a white and gold Episcopal prayer book with gardenias and bouvardia. "Something old" for the bride was an English lace handkerchief from Manchester, England which has been in the family for five generations. As matron of honor Mrs. Clayton Cooper of Compton wore an aquamarine gown complemented by a tiny pink flower hat and a matching Victorian bouquet of tightly-gilded pink rosebuds. Mrs. Hudson wore a royal blue dress with a matching hat, white accessories and a corsage of bouvardia and gardenias.
