

Approval has been given by the Torrance City Council to the petition of Henry Conze for a zoning variance to permit construction and operation of a beauty shop at 24043 Ocean avenue in the Meadow Park tract.

Approval also was given to the final tract map for Tract 15230, presented by John Kettler. The tract is bounded by Border avenue, Lincoln street, Western avenue and 228th street.

The Council also upheld the Commission's action in rezoning Tract 15157, at the northwest corner of Crenshaw and 174th street, and set the final hearing on the matter for Dec. 14.

### THE CHRISTMAS SPIRIT

To an increasing number of people Christmas is becoming a sort of year round affair. They begin to save money for Christmas more than a year in advance. And the interesting thing is that most of them keep it up throughout the year.

On Dec. 2, many millions of dollars will be distributed in California from the Christmas Club accounts which the foresighted started early in December last year. One bank reports that it alone will send out \$19 million to 180,000 Christmas Club members. This is an increase of \$3½ million and 30,000 members over the 1947 totals.

Indications are that Christmas savings as a whole throughout California may top even the high wartime year of 1942. On a national scale this type of thrift has reached well into the billions with millions of persons participating.

Bankers estimate that about 70 per cent of the money distributed each December goes into trade channels through the purchase of gifts and other items; five per cent is used to pay old bills, taxes, etc.; 12 per cent is invested in stocks, bonds and the like; and 13 per cent goes back into savings.

Probably the most encouraging thing is that so many people are saving in spite of the living costs. This shows a wide determination to get ahead financially and to keep ahead.
