**Community Chest to Launch Four-Day Emergency Drive**

An emergency Community Chest campaign will be held in Torrance on Jan. 10, 11, 12 and 13. At the end of the regular campaign the quota was 1 1/2 million dollars short. Community Chest leaders say that the goal was a rock bottom figure, allowing for no expansion of services. The increased amount of money needed was due to increase in expenses in all the agencies because of higher costs of agency operation. Individuals and businesses are being asked to give more to Community Chest this year than they have given in the past in order to carry on existing services.

Local YWCA Program Director Miss Elaine Alsebrook has been appointed district coordinator for the emergency campaign. The headquarters will be at the First District Welfare Center, 1339 Post avenue, Torrance. Agency staff members will devote the four days to campaign work. Local agencies which will curtail their services in order to carry on the campaign include Boy Scouts, Camp Fire Girls, Catholic Welfare Bureau, Family Service, Girl Scouts, Salvation Army, Veterans' Service Center and YWCA. Local agencies are much concerned over the success of this emergency campaign. If the additional money is not raised there is a possibility that all service will be cut approximately 20 percent or that separate units of service such as the YWCA work in Torrance, might be completely eliminated.

Volunteer workers are needed for the emergency campaign. Any person who would be interested should telephone the Welfare Center, Torrance 1356, for specific assignments. A meeting to brief workers and to give them assignments will be held at 1:30 p.m. tomorrow at the Torrance Chamber of Commerce.
