Heated Road Being Tested

Radiant heating of highways by electricity is being tested this winter on a 500-foot section of roadway in an outlying Detroit area.
The heating element is a steel mesh, 18 inches wide, 1 1/2 inches under the road surface. Two rows of mesh (one for each tire track) are under traffic lanes one each side of the road.
Thermostats control the heat, to keep the road surface at least at 35 degrees. Until a device is perfected to react to snow and sleet, the system will be put in operation manually, to keep it from operating in dry weather.

Loranger to Get Peek at 1949 'Chevy'
To be there for the opening of the curtain that has kept secret the details of the 1949 Chevrolets, Paul Loranger, owner of Paul's Chevrolet, 1840 Cabrillo avenue, entrained today for San Francisco to attend a dealer's sneak preview of the new models.
The showing will be the first time that any information on the new models has been made available—even to dealers, Loranger said. The one-day preview will be attended by Chevrolet dealers from the entire Pacific Coast.
With improvements of seven years that have been forthcoming since the beginning of the war, the new models will reveal unexpected developments, Loranger stated.
Although details have not been released even to sales people, Loranger expects the '49 models to have greater vision, more interior roominess, and increased performance.
He was basing his opinion on two slogans that have come out of General Motors' headquarters describing the new models — "Strikes a New Note" and "The Most Beautiful Buy of All."
The local dealer will display three models he is expecting to arrive in the near future. A specially draped show room will be provided in the service department of the Cabrillo avenue address.

Huge Windfall Under Prop. 4
Los Angeles county will have a windfall of \$4,286,077 as a result of the state taking over administration of aged and blind aid on Jan. 1, under the terms of Prop. 4, California Taxpayers' Association estimated today.
The estimated surplus includes \$2,986,734 budgeted for the county's share of aid to the needy aged for the January to June, 1949, period, and \$237,856 budgeted for aid to the blind, together with \$1,032,487 budgeted for administrative costs for aged and blind aid for December, 1948, through June, 1949.
