Coach Cliff Graybehl has decided to lay off practice encounters this week in order to rest his boys for the forthcoming tilt. His gang had apparently too many practice games in the previous week and were dead on their feet when Samohi came to town.

Milo Goettisch plays his final game against Beverly Hills as a Goettisch graduate. Harry Theodis becomes eligible and probably will take over at the guard position.

Paul Smith banged the bucket for over 20 points for the third straight game Friday night and is the Tartars' best hope for an upset over the hillmen. Graybehl has nothing but praise for the spider-like center and calls him the most improved player on the team.

Smith's 21 points were not enough and the locals retained their consistent record as Santa Monica whipped them by a 47-38 margin.

Carroll Adams, Joel Mais and

Bob Hambling hit the hoop for 13, 12 and 10 points respectively to lead the Viking attack. After the home town boys took a 10-9 advantage in the opening quarter the Vikings caught fire and sizzled the net for a 30-17 lead at the rest period. 


TARTAR BEES TO TRY FOR UPSET TOMORROW

LEAGUE-LEADING NATIONAL SUPPLY VIES WITH LAST YEAR'S CHAMPS IN MAJOR TIFF

National Supply's league-leading bucket brigade and Fenwick's Shoe Repair, defending city champs, come to grips in the final game Monday night as the first round of the city circuit nears its climax. Rolling up a total of 119 markers in their first three contrasts, in the National Supply tops the league in offense. Fenwick's boasts the best league defensive record being touched for 64. Having lost only one game by a scant one-point margin, the repairmen seek to upset the factory gang.

Duke Olson, Fran Munsterman and Bob Fresenius who burned the nets registering 51 tallies in their last game, are three big reasons why National should go on with an undefeated record.

The three hoop stars hit for 20, 16 and 15 points respectively as National racked up a 54-37 advantage over Goodyear Monday night. With the aid of the games top scorer, Woody Coleman, with 21, the rubbermen started with a bang and led 8-1 in the opening quarter.

The young National team, however, soon outran their older opponents narrowing the margin to 8-6 by the end of the quarter and going out in front with two quick buckets by Munsterman in the second period. Columbia's Steel Company jumped to a 5-4 margin by the end of the first quarter, slipped to the short end of a 19-7 count at the rest period and fell to a 36-13 onslaught at the hands of Fenwick's.
