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

Sealed proposals will be received at the office of the City Clerk of the City of Torrance, California, until 11 o'clock p.m. on March 22, 1949, at which time they will be publicly opened and read, for the furnishing of materials, tools, services and labor for the improvement of certain streets and rights-of-way in the City of Torrance by the complete construction and installation therein of a sanitary sewer system, consisting of the following items and approximate quantities:

1. 1349 lin. ft. 12" Standard Strength V.C. Pipe with cement joints, including wyes in place.
2. 2429 lin. ft. 12" Extra Strength V.C. Pipe with cement joints, including wyes in place.

No bid will be considered unless it is tendered on the special proposal form furnished by the City Engineer. Each bid must be accompanied by a certified check or bidder's bond in an amount equal to at least ten percent of the amount of the bid, made payable to the City of Torrance. Said certified check or bidder's bond will be forfeited should the successful bidder fail to enter into a contract to do the work herein specified and to furnish the necessary bonds within twenty-five days after the date of the first publication of the notice of award of contract.

Notice is hereby given that the successful bidder will be required to furnish a surety bond satisfactory to the City Council in an amount of not less than fifty percent of the amount of the bid as guarantee of faithful performance of the contract, and a labor and material bond satisfactory to the City Council in an amount of not less than fifty percent of the amount of the bid.

Notice is also given that, pursuant to the provisions of Section 1770 of the Labor Code of the State of California, the City Council has ascertained the general prevailing rate of per hour wages in the locality in which the work is to be done for each craft or type of workman as follows:

Foremen, except as otherwise separately classified, shall be paid not less than \$1.40 per day more than the above rates for the highest classification over which they have supervision.

The above rates are based on an eight-hour day. Holiday and overtime rates shall be one and one-half times the above per hour rates except for watchmen and flagmen.

All bids will be compared on the City Engineer's estimate of the quantities of work to be done.

No bid will be considered from a contractor who has not been licensed in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 791, Statutes of 1929, as amended.

Notice is hereby given that proceedings for said work have been taken under and in accordance with Division 7 of the Streets and Highways Code of the State of California, commonly known as the Improvement Act of 1911, and all acts supplementary thereto and amendatory thereof.

Upon satisfactory completion of all work required by the plans and specifications, an assessment roll and statement will be made and a warrant attached thereto, in the manner provided for by the "Improvement Act of 1911", in the amount of the total value of the work completed plus the amount of the incidental expenses paid to the City by the Contractor, less the amount of the cash payment by the City of Torrance.

Plans, specifications and proposal forms may be obtained from the office of the City Engineer, City Hall, Torrance, California, upon a deposit of Five Dollars (\$5.00), which deposit is refundable upon the return of the plans and specifications at any time within ten (10) days from the date of the award of contract.
