Wielding his first golf club, Supervisor Raymond V. Darby last Thursday afternoon "broke ground" for the new Alondra Park Golf course with a number five iron.

Braving a cold March drizzle along with nearly half a hundred golf enthusiasts, Darby dug a good-sized divot to officially start the construction of an 18-hole course at Alondra Park.

The course to be developed by Cecil Hollingsworth, UCLA coach and Gomer "Potlicker" Sims, Los Angeles Amateur Golf Champion, is located on a 180-acre site at Alondra Park—Crenshaw and Redondo Beach Boulevard. Sims, owner of the Sports Club here, is associated also with Hollingsworth in the management of the Meadow Lark course in Long Beach.

Promising to be on hand for the dedication ceremonies in January when the course is expected to be completed, was Mrs. Helen Pain, wife of the president of the Public Links association. Mrs. Pain held an umbrella to protect the officials from what Supervisor Darby described as condensed California sunshine.




