Rev. Cecil England, First Christian Church, "I thirst";

Rev. Arthur Pedersen, Four Square Church, "It is finished";

Salvage Drive Ends Saturday The Torrance Salvage Week drive was reported in "full swing" yesterday by Mayor J. Hugh Sherkey Jr., general chairman of the Salvation Army's annual Spring project.

The week-long special campaign for unwanted clothing, furniture, and articles will continue through Saturday.

In taking advantage of Spring-cleaning activities in homes and offices, the Salvation Army Social Service Center serving this area seeks discarded articles for subsequent resale in Salvation Army salvage stores.

"Through this program," Mayor Sherkey said, "men who otherwise would be unemployed are given an opportunity to help themselves to get back 'on their feet'."

Last year the service center processed over seven million pounds of salvage materials and provided 919,714 hours of paid employment, \$1,377 meals, and 19,749 beds.

Atonement is Easter Topic of Science Church

The Golden Text of the Sunday Lesson-Sermon on "Doctrine of Atonement" at the Torrance branch of The Mother Church, The First Church of Christ Scientist, in Boston, is from John's Gospel, and reads: "John seeth Jesus coming unto him, and saith, Behold, the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world."

The Lesson-Sermon includes Bible citations from Matthew and Mark: "Then the eleven disciples went away into Galilee, into a mountain where Jesus had appointed them . . . And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying, All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth. Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost." "And these signs shall follow them that believe: In my name shall they cast out devils; they shall lay hands on the sick, and they shall recover."

In "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" Mary Baker Eddy says, "Jesus established his church and maintained his mission on a spiritual foundation of Christ-healing. He taught his followers that his religion had a divine Principle, which would cast out error and heal both the sick and the sinning."

Disability Payments Here Total \$11,000

During the month of March benefits amounting to \$11,821.23 were received by people in the Torrance area who were eligible to receive benefits under the California Department of Employment's Disability Insurance program, according to V. I. Hetzel, Long Beach District Manager of the program.

Hetzel pointed out that failure to file claims within the specified time limit has resulted in losses of benefits in some cases.

"First claims for disability insurance benefits must be mailed not later than the 28th day of sickness or injury which causes the loss of wages," he declared. "Employees who wait until they return to work before filing claims may find they have lost one or more weeks of benefit payments because of the delay. Regulations also require that the
