 Sea Scout Ship 213-B is still without a sponsor. This ship, composed of ten young men who have worked long and hard to bring the Sea Scout program again to Torrance, will lose its charter if a sponsor is not found by June 15th.
 After canvassing almost all of the service clubs in this community, these boys have come to the sad conclusion that perhaps no one is interested in them, their ship, or their program. Some clubs are already sponsoring a great variety of youth organizations, and these are to be commended, but the vast majority have answered their plea with a flat and irrevocable no.
 The scout leaders of Torrance have long felt the general apathy on the part of many of the citizens of this town toward the scout movement, but nowhere has it become so glaringly evident. We have worked hard, without pay, to bring the Scouting program to Torrance, and yet there are many persons here that do not know that there are eight Scout units in town, ready and willing to offer the high adventures of scouting to any boy who may wish it.
 These Sea Scouts have an excellent boat, an officer's landing craft, 38-foot long, donated by the Navy. The boat's diesel engine has just been completely overhauled at a cost of over \$2000 by the Navy. The boat is now at the Senior Scout Base located at Cabrillo Beach, San Pedro, where the Scouts have put in long hours of work scraping and painting the hull. If sponsorship for this unit is not forthcoming soon, all this work will be to no avail, and these boys finally will be convinced that Torrance does not choose to have the benefit of the Sea Scout program.
