Navy Seeks More Week-End Flyers

The Navy is seeking more volunteer "week-end warriors" for its Naval Reserve aviation program.

Naval Reservists who participate in the program in cities and towns throughout the country usually receive group instruction and flight training during off-work hours on week-ends.

All aviation personnel in the Naval Reserve, and other reservists whose postwar experi-

ence or training qualifies them for assignment to aviation activities, are eligible to participate.

The program has no set personnel quotas. A few reservists can establish a Volunteer Aviation Unit (VAU) within any of the nine continental Naval Districts by applying to the District Commandant. Each unit di-

rects and encourages maintenance and development of aviation skills, and training of its members through group instruction, lectures, films, and self-study.

At present, 102 VAUs are established. Their membership includes 3,000 officers and approximately 8,000 enlisted personnel. The members of the volunteer

units receive no compensation.

From the basic VAU, Volunteer Aviation Units that have available airfields, and show potential strength and interest, can be upgraded to qualify for actual flight training, either at Naval Air Reserve stations or local airfields where arrangements are made to fly in Navy planes for week-end use.
