THREE ARTS ANNOUNCES DATE OF DANCE REVUE

May Disability Payments Here Nearly \$10,000.

Payments of state disability insurance in Torrance area during May amounted to \$9,991.01, according to V. L. Hetzel, manager of the California Department of Employment's Disability Division Office in Long Beach.

"Most disability insurance claimants are eligible for the maximum weekly benefit rate of \$25 because of the high amount of the earnings during their qualifying base periods," Hetzel pointed out. "These benefits alleviate to some degree the loss of income suffered by individuals who become unemployed because of non-occupational sickness or injury."

Disability Insurance coverage is guaranteed to all employees who are subject to the State Unemployment Insurance Act. Local workers who are unemployed for eight days or more because of illness or injury should contact the Torrance office of the Department of Employment, Hetzel said.
