Bequest of \$18,000 Made to Local Christian Church

A bequest of \$18,000 to the First Christian Church was made known Monday night by Edward Pietzchke, executor of the will of the late Chester E. Smead, donor of the gift. The late Mr. Smead, a Hermosa Beach resident and member of the local church, died last year at the age of 80 years. He was Samaritan who while living tried to spread happiness among his fellow men to help make the world a better place in which to live.

The gift will be used to bolster the building fund of the church. The fund now totals \$30,000, according to Rev. Cecil England, pastor. Announcement of the gift was made at the annual meeting of the congregation last Monday evening over which Mr. Charles Stock, chairman of the board, presided.
