Seaside Ranchos' Fourth of July carnival to raise money for street lights was so successful it will be held again next year—just for fun!

The carnival netting the street lighting fund more than \$3000 put the campaign over the \$2100 mark, according to Harvey Spelman, president of the Seaside Homeowners' Association.

Booths selling pastry, water-melons, and soft drinks catered to the estimated crowd of more than 1000 people who attended the day-long affair.

Other highlights of the day's events included a children's parade led by the Girl Scout Troop No. 1055 which is under the leadership of Mrs. Robert Hyder. The Seaside baseball team defeated a squad from near-by Hollywood Riviera to capture the perpetual trophy designed and built by Paul Barth of 5322 Carol Drive.

The drawing for prizes offered by merchants in the area and television set closed the campaign. The drawing was held in the carnival-decorated garage of the Paul Rottgers, 5321 Linda Drive.
