

BEACH BAN EXTENDED
The State Board of Health Tuesday extended its quarantine closing of Los Angeles County beaches. The ban covers the beaches north from 27th street, Manhattan Beach, to Ocean Park Pier.
The action became necessary due to the increase of bacterial sewage, stated health authorities.

Gas Rate Hike Hearing Slated
Application of Southern California Gas Co. for increased gas rates will be heard October 10 to 17 by the State Public Utilities Commission.
The increase of about 19 per cent in domestic and commercial gas rates would raise the domestic bills 75 cents a month, it is estimated.

Steel Firm Names New Executives

O. L. Pringle has been elected vice president in charge of sales and Lawrence S. Dahl has been named vice president in charge of operations by the Columbia Steel Company, it was announced late yesterday by Alden G. Roach, president of the United States Steel subsidiary.
Pringle, who has served as vice president in charge of operations of Columbia Steel Company since 1938, is widely known in the steel industry. He will fill the position vacated by the recent death of Frank B. DeLong.
Dahl comes to Columbia from Carnegie-Illinois Steel Corporation, also a subsidiary of United States Steel. He has been general superintendent of Carnegie's operation in the Youngstown, Ohio, district since 1947.
Roach also announced the appointment of H. S. Worthington as assistant to the vice president in charge of operations. In his new position, Worthington will work closely with Pringle and Dahl in coordinating customer requirements with the company's steel products and a operations.

Rape Charge Hearing Continued

The hearing, which was set for last Thursday, was reportedly postponed in order that Drew's lawyer could be present at another trial.
Drew was arrested here July 5 after two Torrance Police officers investigated repeated soundings of an auto horn and broke in on what they said was an attempted attack on a 25-year-old Wilmington waitress.
Name of the woman, who is said to be the wife of a Navy man on overseas duty, was withheld by police. She told police that she had met Drew earlier in the evening in a Wilmington cafe and they had driven to a spot on Maple avenue, just south of Torrance boulevard, where the alleged attack took place.
Drew is now free on \$1000 bail, police stated.
