**Ernie Mosher Sells Out at Lomita Progress**

"I'm going to take a good, long rest."  
 With these words, E. M. "Ernie" Mosher announced that he is selling his weekly Lomita Progress to James E. Philby and Hubert E. Philby of Oskaloosa, Iowa.  
 Transfer rites are scheduled for consummation at 10 a.m. Monday when the paper will be turned over to the Iowa pair, who couldn't be reached for comment on future plans.  
 In fact, all circumstances concerning the sudden sale after some 25 years were somewhat hush-hush down 24648 Narbonne avenue way, but it was disclosed in a compulsory legal notice that the Mosher will still hold a mortgage on the property.  
 According to the notice which ran in the Progress minus editorial acknowledgement, the printing business is to be included in the transfer.  
 After skipping much other interesting and illuminating data, Mosher said that he bought the Progress in 1926.

The establishment of the Progress in 1925 by Sam Sprecker was fostered by a group who lead the first attempt to incorporate the community as a city of the sixth class.  
 When the incorporation movement failed, Sprecker sold out to Mosher.  
 Upon purchase of the Progress, Mosher enlarged the paper's format to seven columns and installed what he called an "Independent Republican editorial policy."  
 The retiring publisher declined to say whether or not he plans to re-enter the publishing business.

"I'm going to take a vacation, that's all," he said.  
 The NEWS, Lomita's pioneer newspaper, was established in 1919, six years prior to the entry of the second newspaper in the Lomita field.

 The law states in general that any person applying for a license as a broker or salesman of real property, shall have two full years of actual broker or sales experience in the field, or shall have been graduated from an accredited college or university at which his major subjects are concerned with real estate.
