\$642,783 Budget For 1949-50 Receives First Hearing

Operating the city for the coming year is expected to cost \$642,783, according to the announcement of the budget by City Manager George Stevens at the Council meeting Tuesday night.

Though the city showed an increase in population of 15 per cent the 1949-50 proposed budget was held to a \$55,000 increase over last year.
