HURRICANE AID

American Red Cross dollars went to work this week as the rehabilitation phase of the Florida hurricane got under way.

This was the information relayed to Chapter Chairman Clarence S. Beesmyer from National Red Cross disaster officials in Washington following announcement that during the emergency stage of the hurricane, Red Cross made available an initial allotment of \$100,000 to carry out emergency projects.

As in all major disasters, the staffs of Florida Red Cross chapters have been augmented by trained disaster relief and rehabilitation personnel from the National headquarters. These people will be charged with the responsibility of gathering data so that the Red Cross can "play its role of returning the victims to their pre-disaster status."

The Florida rehabilitation project will include the rebuilding and refurbishing of homes; the supplying of temporary shelter, food and clothing. Red Cross explained.
