

TRIP OF THE WEEK THE SOUTH-COAST BEACHES



Extending southeastward from Long Beach is a wondrous shore line of curling seascapes, quiet lagoons and bays and a wide variety of surfside recreation that combine to offer an appealing invitation for summer motoring. Moreover, if time allows, one may enjoy bathing or surf fishing at several points along the route.

1. The modern seashore metropolis of Long Beach is California's fifth largest city. A short stay here might include a visit to such attractions as the Rainbow amusement pier, Signal Hill (center photo), Bixby Park, the harbor area and Alamitos Bay. When the fleet is anchored offshore, one has ample opportunity to admire some of our finest warships...

2. Along the water's edge around Huntington Beach rises a giant forest of oil derricks. It is said that the "black gold" taken from these great fields has made this city one of the richest communities of its size in California. Surprisingly, the beach is clean and swimming is good. If one enjoys surf fishing, the municipal pier is worth a try...

3. In Balboa Bay (lower photo), sailboats, motor launches and watercraft of every type and size skim over the blue water, presenting a scene of constant and colorful activity. Balboa's glittering Tournament of Lights is to be held this year on September 10...

4. Shore line scenes such as the one illustrated in the top photo are much in evidence as one nears



Laguna Beach. The cultivated quaintness of this community's rustic dwellings and shops is due to the influence of its artists' colony—as are its studios, little theater and art association gallery...

5. Overlooking Dana Cove is the residential hamlet of Dana Point, first described by Richard Henry Dana when the "Pilgrim" landed here in 1835. Dana Point was a regular stopping point for Boston traders in the early days. One mile southward is Doheny State Park, a delightful picnic haven...

6. The much-pictured ruins of San Juan Capistrano Mission are dear to the hearts of California mission romanticists. The church is in much the same condition to which the 1812 and 1918 earthquakes reduced it; few of the subsidiary structures having been restored.


