Scouting . . . Around

Last Wednesday, September 7, you probably found on your doorstep a handbill reading "Wanted for Murder." I hope you didn't just glance at it and then throw it away. It contained fourteen excellent suggestions that the home-owner may follow to help alleviate the current fly menace that is now plaguing the city of Torrance. These handbills were authored by the Fly Abatement Committee of Torrance and were distributed for this group by the Boy Scouts of America. Twenty-nine Scouts, members of Troops 219, 241, and 721, took part in the distribution. Aided by a bus of the Torrance Municipal Bus Lines, the Scouts covered all of the metropolitan district of Torrance as well as Kettler Knolls, Wateria, Seaside Ranchos, Hollywood Riviera, and Torrance Manor. The distribution of the fly campaign literature served a three-fold purpose as far as the Scouts were concerned. First of all it should mean a great deal to every Scout. Secondly the distribution of these handbills was a service project for the city. Last but not least, in this project the Scouts met a portion of the requirements for the Public Health Merit Badge, an award that is required for higher advancement in Scouting. This Merit Badge requires the Scout to perform some community service project in the interests of public health. In view of the fact that the common house fly is a known carrier of typhoid and a suspected carrier of polio, such a fly campaign certainly comes under the heading of public health, and the Scouts participating deserve credit for a job well done.

Troop 219, sponsored by Torrance Kiwanis Club, held their first meeting following summer vacation on Tuesday, Sept. 6. The Troop started the ball rolling with a wienie bake held in Torrance Park. Troop 219, which meets at the Scout Hall at the park, has been inactive during the summer due to the vacations of its members.

Scoutmaster Ralph Allen and his assistant Ed Casey have an excellent setup for the Troop for the coming year. This program includes hikes, camps, and outings, one of which will be an attempt to climb San Antonio Peak, "Old Baldy," in the near future.

Troop 219 meets every Tuesday evening at 7:30.

Troop 241 is now in the throes of reorganization under the new lowered age requirements recently announced by the National Executive Council of the Boy Scouts of America. The Troop has been temporarily split into two patrols, one composed of Explorers, Scouts 14 years old or older, and the other composed of the rest of the boys between the ages of 11 and 14. The younger group will be under the guidance of Assistant Scoutmaster Bob Maxfield, while the Explorers will be led by Assistant Scoutmaster Neal Silence, who is now Post Knox Kentucky Tank Commanders School with the National Guard. During his absence, his post will be filled by some member of the Troop committee.

This arrangement of the troop promises to be very effective in that the two groups will be able to follow their own interests without interference from the other. With an age range of Scouts in the Troop from eleven to seventeen years, such a division is understandable.


Woman Hurt In Car-Truck Collision

'Matter' Text Theme of Scientists

The Golden Text of the Sunday Lesson-Sermon on "Matter" in all branches of The Mother Church, The First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston, is from the Psalms: "Tremble, thou earth, at the presence of the Lord, at the presence of the God of Jacob."

In a Bible citation the Psalmist says, "O Lord, thou hast searched me, and knowest me... Whither shall I go from thy spirit? or whither shall I flee from thy presence? If I ascend up into heaven, thou art there: if I make my bed in hell, behold, thou art there. If I take the wings of the morning, and dwell in the uttermost parts of the sea; Even-there shall thy hand lead me, and thy right hand shall hold me."

The realm of the real is "Spirit," writes Mary Baker Eddy in "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures." She adds, "In Spirit there is no matter, even as in Truth there is no error, and in good no evil."

That matter is substantial or has life and sensation, is one of the false beliefs of mortals, and exists only in a supposititious mortal consciousness. Hence, as we approach Spirit and Truth, we lose the consciousness of matter."
