



LESS THAN TWO WEEKS TO GET THAT AUTO TAG

Less than two weeks remain for local residents to obtain their 1948 silver and red license tabs without penalty. Edgar E. Lampton, director of Motor Vehicles, reminded California's motorists that the close of business February 4 is the deadline for over-the-counter renewals and midnight the same date is the deadline for mail renewals. Double the \$6.00 registration fee and 50 per cent more on vehicle license fees are assessed after that date. Weight fees on commercial vehicles carry a 100 per cent penalty. License tabs are available immediately upon payment of the

higher 1948 fees. The amount will be figured for you if you apply personally for renewal but if you apply by mail to the Department in Sacramento, don't fail to send a money order, certified or cashier's check for the correct amount of fees. To determine what you owe, look in the lower left hand corner of your 1947 white registration card, the only document required for renewal, and add \$3.00 to the figure there. Round off the sum to the nearest dollar and the result will be your 1948 fee. Do not sent your fee in currency or by personal check. Lampton urged motorists to renew their registrations immediately and avoid the last minute rush which occurs each year.

Medical Group Attacks Rebate Practices

In a three-point program calling for hard-hitting action to stamp out rebating practices, both in the medical profession and in optical companies, X-ray and laboratory firms and medical supply houses, the California Medical Association announced Jan. 16 it would: 1. Ask the State Legislature to enact stringent legislation prohibiting "kick-backs" and rebating abuses and setting up stiff penalties for violation of the law either by doctors or by laboratories or firms engaged in selling supplies and appliances. 2. Urge all Better Business Bureau in California to exclude from membership any optical companies, laboratories or medical supply firms engaged in giving or receiving rebates. This move, the CMA announced, is designed to "dry up the source of rebates." 3. Request all County Medical Societies to direct their Committees on Professional Conduct to take prompt and vigorous disciplinary action against any doctor engaging in rebating practices. The three-pronged attack on rebating abuses was announced by the CMA Executive Committee, following a special meeting in San Francisco, and was adopted to implement the action of the Council of the State Medical Association in December, calling for a campaign to wipe out "kick-back" practices.

ERRORS IN GEOMETRY
"Geometry" may have become just a memory mellowed by time in the mind of the average motorist, but he is making a mistake in allowing it to be no more than that. It may, in fact, be costing him money. One form of geometry that affects his purse every day in the year is that involved in the steering mechanism of his car. The carefully worked out steering geometry of any car must be maintained in service, wheels correctly aligned and bearings adjusted, or it will result in unduly rapid tire wear.
