

## CLASSES FOR MENTALLY RETARDED PUPILS ASKED

Special training classes for those mentally retarded minors who may be expected to benefit from such training will be investigated by the Torrance City Schools in the near future, according to J. H. Hull, superintendent of schools.

Hull told members of the Board of Education that approximately 193 students would be affected by the plan. The superintendent's statement followed a talk by Lester Foster, seventh grade teacher at the junior high school and former Army psychological examiner and classifier, before members of the board. Foster's talk explained the recently passed State Senate Bill 133. In his talk, Foster said that under this bill, which becomes effective July 1, 1948, Torrance will have to establish these special classes since the school district has more than 15 mentally retarded children.

The plan is similar in structure to the programs now in effect in other districts providing for the training of the blind, deaf, and crippled, Foster pointed out. He explained that the bill obligates the state to pay 75 percent of the additional cost above the average daily attendance.
