

## Three Services To Be Held At Saint Andrew's

There will be three complete choral communion services at St. Andrew's Episcopal church on Easter morning.

The first service will begin at 7:30 a.m., the second at 9:30 and the third at 11:30 o'clock.

The 7:30 and 11:30 will be duplicate services, with the senior church choir in charge of the music. The Introit will be the Easter day canticle; the gradual, "O Come and Adorn"; by Adams and the offertory, "Come Ye Faithful" by Adams. Incidental solos throughout the numbers will be sung by Miss Elsie May Church, soprano; Frank Church and Arthur Solomon, tenors and Dave Jones, bass.

At the 9:30 service the girls' choir of the church school will present the special music. The gradual will be "Holy City" by Steven Adams, and the offertory "Come Sing With Exultation" by William Spence. The soloist will be Miss Mary Lou Hovind, soprano; Miss Amy Bourquin will be the organist and direct the choir.

There will be a sermon at each of the three services, and the general theme will be "The New World of Today." The sermons at these services will be preached by the rector, the Rev. Torben R. Olsen.

## Services For Holy Week

Holy Week services are being held throughout this week at St. Margaret-Mary church with Rev. John V. Hegarty, pastor, officiating.

Holy Thursday services began this morning with communion at both the 6 and 7:30 a.m. services followed by High Mass at the Altar of Repose at 8 o'clock.

This evening at 7:30 o'clock Rev. Hegarty will deliver the Holy Thursday sermon. Members of the various guilds of the Altar Society will form a guard of honor throughout the day for the exposition of the Blessed Sacrament.

On Good Friday, Mass of the Pre-sanctified will be said at 8 a.m. At 3:00 p.m. and at 7:30 in the evening Stations of the Cross will commemorate the passion and death of Christ. Rev. Father Dominic Daly, newly appointed assistant pastor, will preach a special sermon.

With Mrs. Thomas Rossbottom directing, the Senior choir will again be heard at the 10 o'clock Low Mass singing "O Filii of Filiae," "Regina Coeli" and "Mystery of Love." This will be followed by the Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament. Mrs. Paul Laine, church organist, will play for all services.
