WATER VOTE CALLED FOR APRIL 30TH

The Board of Directors of the West Basin Municipal Water District Monday adopted a resolution calling for a special water district election to be held Friday, April 30.

Purpose of the election is to annex the West Basin Municipal Water district to the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California subject to terms and conditions fixed by the Metropolitan Board of Directors.

The vote was unanimous. All five Board members were present.

The resolution also established consolidated election precincts, designated polling places, election officers and provided for canvassing the vote on May 4. Terms and conditions asked by Metropolitan are:

1) That in addition to regular Metropolitan taxes, back taxes and interest in the amount of \$4,104,000 be paid in 30 equal installments over a period of 30 years, commencing with the 1949-50 fiscal year.

2) That West Basin District annexation be completed prior to next Dec. 1.

3) That Metropolitan pay for a pipeline extending west from Avalon boulevard and terminating in the vicinity of Manhattan Beach boulevard and that 10 turnouts be provided, five on the new line and five on existing Metropolitan lines.

It is estimated that there are between 45,000 and 60,000 registered voters in the district which comprises, besides, Lomita, Manhattan Beach, Redondo Beach, Hermosa Beach, El Segundo, Palos Verdes Estates, Lawndale, Lennox, Palos Verdes Hills, Moneta and Watson.

Carl Fossette was employed as general manager for the West Basin District at the meeting. Kenneth K. Wright, Los Angeles, has been employed as West Basin attorney.

According to the Board's resolution the April 30 question before voters of the district will be put thus: "Shall the corporate area of West Basin Municipal Water District be annexed to and become a part of the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California, subject to the terms and conditions fixed by the Board of Directors of said Metropolitan Water District of Southern California?"
