**Edison Company
Dedicates New
Redondo Plant**

NOW IN SERVICE

Ultimately to add 264,000 kilowatts of new generating capacity to the Edison system, the Redondo Steam Station is now in service with the first two of four 66,000 kilowatt generating units. Construction work at the plant is continuing, and its entire capacity is expected to be available by 1950.

Other increases in supplies of power, as well as new transmission and distribution facilities, make up the Edison Company's \$199,000,000 system-wide expansion program to increase capacities in all phases of operation.

Gains in generating capacity and the recent drought-relieving snow and rain in the High Sierra have removed the threat of a power shortage in Southern California. The Edison Company will be able to take care of its power commitments to other companies, its own expected load growth and still be in as good or even better position to meet the electric energy needs of its customers as it was last year.

TECHNICAL IMPROVEMENTS

Other innovations include the pumping of fuel oil directly to the boiler burners, which eliminates the necessity for intermediate tanks; provisions for the use of oil or gas for fuel, with space for coal if sometime required; extensive use of outdoor equipment wherever practicable and many technical improvements in both construction and electrical fields. Standard turbines and boilers were adapted to plant design to hasten delivery and speed early completion of the plant.

MANY UNIQUE FEATURES

One of the most efficient and modern steam stations in the world, the Redondo Station was constructed with several unique features. Ocean water, used in vast quantities for cooling purposes, is pumped to and from the station through two submarine tunnels extending 1,300 feet out into the sea. To prevent the accumulation of troublesome marine growth in undersea conduits, the direction of flow and temperature of the discharge water, which is approximately 20 degrees warmer than intake water, is periodically alternated.
