### Injunction May End Dust Bowl

veloped for five years or more automatically reverts to the city or state."

Smith replied that he had never heard of such a law. Dralle said he would like to have the city attorney search the statutes anyway.

Drale then said he believed the owners of the property should be required to erect the dust-tight fence requested by the petitioners.

"This is going to be a long-drawn-out affair. I can see that right now," said Councilman Bob Haggard.

Mayor J. Hugh Sherley Jr. said he doubted that a high fence would be a solution to the problem, which has been aggravated by the unusually dry winter. He wanted to know whether the Santa Fe company had been informed of the dust conditions created east of their land.

"The renter told me he had leased it for farming and that he was going to farm it," said City Administrator George Stevens. Mrs. Brown said he was farming it "thoroughly" because he had diked it almost continuously for the last nine months.

"I've visited some 500 homes with my petition and in almost every one of them I've found people suffering from respiratory illnesses from which they say they cannot get any relief because of the terrible dust," said Mrs. Brown. "They tell me further that their doctors have told them they cannot expect to get well unless they move out of the area, which means giving up their established homes."

W. A. Peterson of Beech avenue told the council the dust was from five to eight feet deep along the edge of the street in front of his house.

Mayor Sherley was for referring the entire matter to City Attorney Smith, to determine the possibility of a restraining order, and later an injunction. Smith said the city may lack authority to abate the dust as a nuisance, and suggested that the petitioners seek relief directly from the district attorney's office.

With Councilman Dralle voting no, the Council left the matter in Smith's hands and he will report back at the next Council meeting.


