

**ORDINANCE NO. 408**  
**AN ORDINANCE TO ORDER THE VACATION OF A PORTION OF LOT 1, TRACT 769, SHOWING A-27 OF BLOCK 27, TORRANCE TRACT, AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 393.**

The City Council of the City of Torrance does hereby declare its intention to order the vacation, closing and abandonment of the certain portion of that alley described as follows:

Beginning at the most westerly corner of Lot 3, Tract 769, as shown on a map recorded in Map Book 115, Page 56, in the Office of the Recorder of Los Angeles County, California, thence N 47° 29' 50" E 37.21 feet; thence north-easterly and northwesterly along the southwesterly line of Lot 2 and not of 1 of section 30 of T. 1 S. to a point on the westerly line of said Lot 1, thence S 0° 34' 31" E along the southeasterly prolongation of said lot line 64.22 feet; thence N 89° 25' 00" E 6.98 feet to the point of beginning.

That the portions of said alley to be vacated and abandoned are more particularly shown upon a map bearing the legend: MAP SHOWING A-27 OF BLOCK 27, TORRANCE TRACT, IN THE CITY OF TORRANCE, which map is hereby approved for the purpose of this proceeding and is hereby ordered filed in the office of the City Clerk of the City of Torrance, and marked "Filed April 27, 1948."

That the City Clerk of the City of Torrance is hereby directed to cause this ordinance to be published, in the manner prescribed by law for the publishing of ordinances of the City of Torrance, in the Torrance Herald, a weekly newspaper of general circulation, published and circulated in said City and the official newspaper thereof.

That the City Clerk of the City of Torrance is hereby directed to post or cause to be posted, conspicuously along the line of the alley proposed to be vacated, notices of such vacation, in the form and manner required by the legislation act hereinafter mentioned.

That in the herein proposed vacation of said alley aforesaid, the Council of the City of Torrance hereby directs to proceed under and in pursuance of the provisions of the State of California, Chapter 250, Statutes of 1941, as amended.


