The northeasterly ten feet (10') of Newton Street, being eighty (80') in width, beginning at the easterly boundary line of Madison Street, as shown on Tract No. 9675 recorded in Map Book 170 at pages 12, 11 and 12 in the Los Angeles County Recorder's Office, thence southeasterly to the intersection of the prolonged boundary line of Pacific Coast Highway, being 100' in width, as shown on page 18 of Plan and Profile as adopted by the State of California Highway Commission, December 15, 1933.

PARCEL II
The southeasterly ten feet (10') of Newton Street, being eighty (80') in width, beginning at the easterly boundary line of Madison Street, as shown on Tract No. 9675 recorded in Map Book 170 at pages 10, 11 and 12 in the Los Angeles County Recorder's Office, thence southeasterly to the intersection of the prolonged boundary line of Pacific Coast Highway, being 100' in width, as shown on page 18 of Plan and Profile as adopted by the State of California Highway Commission, December 15, 1933.

That the portions of said street so vacated and abandoned and the details thereof are shown on a map bearing the title "MAP SHOWING PROPOSED VACATION OF PORTION OF NEWTON STREET IN THE CITY OF TORRANCE" which map is hereby approved for the purpose of this ordinance and the public order by the City Clerk of the City of Torrance and which map is hereby referred to for particulars as to the proposed vacation.

That the 20th day of July, 1948, at 8:00 P.M. of said day, in the Council Chambers in the City of Torrance, California, and the same is hereby fixed as the time and place for the holding of a public hearing on the proposed vacation of said street.

That the City Clerk of the City of Torrance is hereby directed to cause this ordinance to be published in the public order and ordinances of the City of Torrance, in the Torrance place of publication and in the official newspaper of said city and the official newspaper thereof.

That the City Clerk of the City of Torrance is hereby directed to post or cause to be posted, conspicuously along the line of the street such vacation, in the form and manner required by the legislative act hereinafter mentioned.

That the proposed vacation of said street aforementioned, the Council of the City of Torrance hereby approves and orders to be vacated, in pursuance of the provisions of the State of California (Chapter 250, Statutes of 1941) as amended.


