### Buys Business Playa del Rey Study Started

Feasibility of developing a small boat harbor in Playa del Rey is being studied by Colonel William Fox and County Manager Wayne Allen of the Regional Planning Commission.

Following their study of the project the two men will make a recommendation to the Board of Supervisors as to whether the engineering and economic report on the development should be done by county engineers or by an outside group.

During a recent discussion by the Board, Chairman Raymond V. Darby expressed the opinion that the small boat harbor and the recreational development which would surround it could be made completely self-supporting.

### Steel Fencing of High School Site Approved

Complete fencing of the Torrance high school site will be started in the near future, to eliminate possible vandalism, upon instructions of the Board of Education.

Bids for the construction of an eight-foot locklink steel fence now are being sought by Business Manager Emmett W. Ingram, and the cost is estimated at around \$2,500.

The high school site now is completely fenced on the south side, and partially fenced on the north side, but there is free access to the buildings from Plaza Del Amo and from Watson avenue, Ingram said.

A night watchman now is employed, but Ingram said that despite this the building was entered and property removed.

The Board of Education at its last meeting approved the purchase of completely new athletic equipment for the high school varsity team, on Ingram's recommendation. It will be purchased from seven different sporting goods houses who submitted low bids on the different items, aggregating \$2,179.

"This should last five years, by using the old varsity equipment for scrimmaging," Ingram said. The old equipment was inherited from the Los Angeles and Redondo high school districts.

Purchase of the Steinway grand piano in the school auditorium, which has been rented for the last year, also was approved, at a cost of \$914 including equity.

### "Public Notices"

TORRANCE HERALD ORDNANCE NO. 37

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Torrance as follows:

SECTION 1. That the franchise and privilege of erecting, maintaining, operating, repairing, reconstructing, and removing, and of placing, pipe lines for the transportation of oil, gas, gasoline, water, steam, hot water, and other liquid and gaseous substances, together with all manholes, valves, connections and appurtenances necessary or convenient for the operation of said pipe lines, together with poles and conduits with all wires and other appurtenances and equipment for telephone and telegraph lines necessary or convenient for applicant's business, and the operation of said pipe lines, for the term of thirty (30) years, in, under, along and across any and all streets, alleys and other public places, now or hereafter dedicated to public use in the City of Torrance, California.

SECTION 2. The word "grantee," whenever used herein, shall be held to include the grantee or grantees, his, her, its or their successors and assigns.

SECTION 3. That the said franchise and privilege shall be granted and shall be held and enjoyed upon the provisions and conditions prescribed by law and those contained in this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. The term of said franchise and privilege shall run from the date upon which this ordinance shall become effective.

SECTION 5. The grantee of said franchise shall have the right, subject to such regulations as are now or hereafter may be in force, to make all necessary excavations in said streets, alleys and other public places, to construct, maintain, operate, repair, reconstruct, remove or abandon in place said pipe lines or telephone lines, and to place, reconstruct, maintain, operate, repair, reconstruct, remove or abandon in place said poles, conduits, appurtenances and equipment, and to do all things necessary to carry out the provisions and conditions prescribed by law and those contained in this Ordinance.

SECTION 6. The grantee of said franchise shall have the right to construct, maintain, operate, reconstruct, and remove or abandon in place, all pipe lines, manholes, valves, connections and appurtenances and poles, conduits, appurtenances and equipment, and to do all things necessary to carry out the provisions and conditions prescribed by law and those contained in this Ordinance.

SECTION 7. The City of Torrance reserves the right to change the grade of any street over which the franchise is granted, and within a reasonable time to readjust the location of the franchise and to do so at the expense of the grantee. Any change of grade shall change the location of all manholes, valves, connections and appurtenances and poles, conduits, appurtenances and equipment maintained and operated thereunder so as to conform to such change of grade.

SECTION 8. During the life of the franchise, the grantee thereof shall pay to the City of Torrance, in lawful money of the United States, two per cent (2%) of the gross annual receipts of said franchise arising from the use, operation or possession of said franchise. If said two per cent (2%) of gross receipts shall not equal a sum computed at the rate of Sixty Dollars (\$60.00) per mile for all pipe line maintained under the provisions of said franchise, then in addition to said two per cent (2%) of gross receipts, the grantee shall pay an additional amount necessary to make up the difference between the sum computed at the rate of Sixty Dollars (\$60.00) per mile and said payments shall be made annually, on or before the thirty-first (31st) day of August of each year of the use, operation and possession of said franchise during the twelve months ending on the thirty-first (31st) day of the preceding June. In the years of commencement and termination of said franchise, such annual payment shall be prorated according to the period of time said franchise shall have been in effect during such respective years. At the time of making said annual payments the grantee of said franchise shall report, and pay One Dollar (\$1.00) per rod for all pipe line installed under the terms of said franchise during the twelve months ending on the 30th day of the preceding June.

SECTION 9. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force after the expiration of thirty (30) days from and after the date of its passage, and before the expiration of ten (10) days from the date of its passage shall be published once in the Torrance Herald, by newspaper of general circulation in said City of Torrance.
