Board Fixes New Policy

a bus driver and utility man at a salary of \$220 a month.
The board also approved the employment of Minnie Rusk as a housekeeper in Extended Day Care at \$176 a month. Arvel Simmons was employed as a custodian at \$200 a month.
Clerical personnel was employed as follows: Clerks — Anna M. Branum, Marian Leonard Platt, Frances G. Jansson and Edith F. Gunter, and Alice B. Hammond as record clerk five-sixths time.
Cafeteria personnel employed for the year were Carol Leigh Shepard and LeEtta Metzler, to head the group, and Marshall Tappin, Mollie Hoke, Noma Mitchell and Katherine M. Wallace.

To set up the cafeterias at the Perry school and at the high school, the Board of Education approved a loan of \$1000 from school funds. It is hoped that the cafeterias will be self-supporting and that they will be able to repay the loan by the end of the school year, said Emmett Ingram, business manager.
The school administration also was authorized to establish accounts with seven food firms for the purchase of supplies for the two cafeterias, and a separate bank account will be opened locally.

Increase in the district's contract with Dr. Veazie Markham was supported by Dr. Howard E. Wood, board chairman. Dr. Markham's contract was increased to \$2800 annually for two days a week, from \$2100 on a one and one-half day basis, on recommendation of Superintendent J. Henrich Hull.

School Bonds Will Be Sold September 28

Tuesday, Sept. 28, has been set by the Board of Supervisors for opening bids on the total of \$1,504,000 of bonds voted by the Torrance Unified School District last June 4.
The bonds are being issued in denominations of \$1000 each, and will be dated November 1, 1948, and will mature by groups beginning Nov. 1, 1949, and each Nov. 1 thereafter until 1962, according to the official advertisement to bidders.

This will be the first obligation against property in Torrance for the Torrance Unified School District, it is stated, which means that the district has no outstanding bonded indebtedness.
The property within the district, however, is obligated to pay off certain bonds voted when it was a part of the Los Angeles City School District, totaling \$331,431.03.
Estimated population of the Unified District is given as 17,700, and the district's area is 19.25 square miles.
