PERMITS FOR 34 DUPLEXES BOOST TOTAL

October building activity in Torrance continued at a rapid pace this week on the heels of \$346,000 in new permits issued during the first eight days of the month for the 34 new duplexes to be erected in Pine Knolls at Crenshaw boulevard and Dominguez street. Garages are included for each of the 68 new units.

Preparation of the site was nearing completion this week by earth-moving machinery and ditch diggers, following installation of sewer lines last week. The trees which were familiar landmarks along the westerly side of the tract have been felled within the last week and were being removed from the site.


