Your Kitchen Counsellor

CORNEBEEF DINNER

We enjoy a corned beef dinner every now and then. How about you? Corned beef with mustard sauce is mighty tasty. And you can fix it so it's attractive enough to serve for a company dinner.

Have the meat rolled and tied into a firm roll and cook it as directed in the recipe. Bake it on a good-looking heat-proof platter, and take it right to the table. Carve and serve with just the same flourish you'd employ with the most expensive roast. It's delicious and you may be proud.

CORNEBEEF WITH MUSTARD SAUCE

- 4-5 corned beef
 - 5 peppercorns
 - 2 sprigs parsley
 - 1 stalk celery
 - 1 small onion
 - 2 bay leaves
 - 1 Tbsp. prepared mustard
 - 1/2 C. brown sugar
 - 1/2 C. catsup
 - 3 Tbsp. vinegar
 - 3 Tbsp. water
 - 2 Tbsp. margarine or butter
- Wash meat well to remove brine. Place in a large kettle with cold water to cover. Add bay leaves, peppercorns, parsley, celery and onions. Bring to a boil. After boiling 5 minutes, remove scum; cover kettle, reduce heat, and let simmer 40 minutes per pound or until tender. Remove hot meat and place in shallow baking dish. Decorate with whole cloves. Melt margarine or butter in saucepan. Add remaining ingredients and cook, stirring until blended. Pour over meat and bake in moderate oven (350° F.) for 30 minutes basting with sauce in pan. Serve hot or cold. Yield: 8 servings.

SAVORY GREEN BEANS

You don't have to serve cabbage

every time you fix corned beef. Plain boiled potatoes and savory string beans will be fine.

- 1 No. 3 can green beans (drained)
 - 2 Tbsp. bacon drippings
 - 1 Tbsp. finely grated onion
 - 1/2 C. tomato sauce
- Place the ingredients in a 1 qt. casserole dish with its closely fitting lid. Cover and heat in modern gas range oven at 350° F. for 30 minutes.

JELLYED HORSERADISH

Jellyed horseradish is an excellent relish to serve with this dinner. Nice flavor—and so simple to make.

- 6 cloves
 - 1 1/2 C. water
 - 1 pkg. lemon gelatin
 - 1/4 tsp. salt
- Boil cloves in water 3 minutes. Remove cloves. Dissolve gelatin in liquid. Chill. When slightly thickened, add horseradish. Turn into small paper cups. Chill until firm. Serve with corned beef.

CHOCOLATE-SUNDAE PIE

Chocolate-sundae pie will be an elegant finish for this dinner. If you want to leave off the whipped cream, sprinkle the chocolate right over the filling when you put it into the baked pie shell.

- 1 envelope plain gelatin (1 Tbsp.)
 - 3 Tbsp. cold water
 - 8 egg yolks
 - 1/2 C. sugar
 - 1/2 tsp. salt
 - 1/2 tsp. nutmeg
 - 1 1/2 C. scalded milk
 - 1/2 tsp. vanilla
 - 3 egg whites, beaten
 - 1 baked 9-inch pie shell
 - 1 C. cream
 - 1/4 C. grated chocolate
- Soak gelatin in water 5 minutes. Beat egg yolks with dry ingredients; stir in milk. Cook in double boiler until thickened. Remove from burner. Stir in gelatin and vanilla. Chill until partially set; beat foil in egg whites. Pour into shell. Chill. Cover with sweetened whipped cream. Sprinkle with chocolate.
