G. P. Meter Shop Downs Amstan; Takes Dub Crown

Scoring seven times in the fourth inning gave the G. P. Meter Shop the edge necessary to win the Workman's League softball championship on Wednesday night of last week under the arcs at the Torrance City Park. They battled Amstan to an 8-4 final score.

Two nights earlier the two teams had fought to a 5-5 deadlock in a twilight game that was called on account of darkness.

Prior to this game these teams were tied for the league leadership with a record of

five wins and no losses in the second round of play. The win by the G. P. lads made them winners of both rounds, whereas a win by the Amstans would have necessitated another game to determine the championship.

Amstan had the final game apparently all sewed up as they went into the fourth inning with a 4-1 lead. However, their pitcher, Cliff Hamm, who had pitched no-hit ball up to this point, ran into plenty of trouble in the last half of that frame when four successive walks, a fielder's choice, an error, another walk and a lone single poured six runs across the plate for the opponents. Relief hurler Hank Brissinger, who was called in to close the barn door after most of the horses were out, got the hasp in place after giving up one hit and one more run.

Samohi's Air Power Strong

If the Torrance High School Varsity can maintain a tight pass defense against Santa Monica Saturday night, the Tartars should beat the Vikings—defending Bay League champs of last year.

Eliminating the element of luck and depending upon previous facts and performances, the Vikings are not as strong on the ground as the Tartars. In the air, is a Viking of a different color.

That being one Landon Exley who completed 11 out of 19 passes against Jordan and rolled up an impressive 210 aerial gain. Exley can and has caught the defense with their aerial guard down by running to the left to suddenly heave the spheroid deep into the heart of enemy territory. Exley pitches southpaw. Mostly to Rightend O'Brien. If the Tartars can bottle up that combination they will have half of a battle won.


The other half consists of stopping Melvin "Bobo" Lewis, dusky student body president and running powerhouse of the Vikings. Lewis has scored five of the eight touchdowns scored by Santa Monica this year. Against Jordan, the 155-pound half-

back packed the pigskin 22 times for a total gain of 153 yards—approximately seven yards at a crack.

As a team, Santa Monica stands about on a par with Torrance. Each has won three contests and lost one. However, when Santa Monica hit pay dirt there was gold in it since two of the victories were Bay League contests. Samohi is undefeated in the Bay loop while Torrance has broken even in two games. Both have met and defeated Jordan—an early season favorite that now seems to have lost favor as a Bay League contender. Besides the 12-6 win over Jordan, the Vikings have beaten Redondo 13-0, L. B. Poly 12-0, and have fallen before the onslaught of Alhambra, 18-6.

Torrance has hit pay dirt 10 times while Santa Monica has crossed the zero marker eight times. Torrance has eight lettermen on the starting lineup against Santa Monica's seven returning S. M. men.

If Goettsch, Taylor, Licht and Turner in the Tartar backfield can get the same line-smashing support given them by Oefinger and Schultz in the Jordan game, Torrance can and should beat Santa Monica by 12 points.

SAMOH BEE'S NEW TARGET FOR TARBABES

Still seeking their initial league win, Torrance High School's Bee team plays host to a powerful Santa Monica eleven on the local field this afternoon. The kickoff is slated for 3:00 p.m.

Samohi won their opening game 25-0 over Redondo and were beaten 24-0 by Jordan. Coached by Porter Leetch they will employ a spread "T" formation offensive attack.

After spotting Torrance 12 points in the first half Inglewood came back in the fourth quarter to a 13-12 edge over the Tartars last Thursday.

The Tarbabes lost the heart-breaker when Gordy MacQuillen's kick was blocked on the 40-yard marker and picked up by Sentinel end Stan Smith who ran 60 yards to score. Bill Edwards ran the conversion. The visitors scored their other TD on a 30-yard pass in the final seconds of the first half.

Torrance scored in the first quarter with Roy Swigart tossing a 22-yard pass to Dick Wright who made a sensational catch in the end zone.

Standing on his own 28-yard line in the second period Swigart again pitched the pigskin, this time to Wayne Scholl who caught the ball on the Torrance 45 and outpied the entire Inglewood team to the end zone.
