Learn to Live Harmoniously, Says Speaker

Thirty-three members and guests of the Torrance Optimist Club heard an interesting talk by Ferdinand A. Bahr, recreation specialist for the State of California, last Wednesday evening at the Fish Shanty. His topic was "Recreation—A Community Challenge."

Bahr's opening remark was a direct challenge to the community. He said: "Your responsibility as a community is to teach your children to live with other people."

He pointed out that this responsibility begins with the parent right in the child's own home and he stressed the fact that the parents who did things with their children instead of for them were the proud possessors of a family well able to live together within itself, and therefore, a family well prepared to live a full and harmonious life with his neighbor's family, the people of his community, his nation and his world.

Bahr commended the schools for opening the school grounds after regular hours and cooperating with city recreation departments so that persons of all ages in the community may participate in the recreation program.

Bahr's services as a recreation consultant to a community may be obtained free of charge by application of the mayor to the state director of recreation at Sacramento.
