Decision on King Trailer Camp Tonight

Decision on the petition of Arthur C. King for a zoning variance that would permit operation of a trailer camp on 233rd street between Eshelman and Narbonne, will be given by the Torrance City Council at its meeting tonight.

Councilman Dick Draie said he wanted to see the property again before making his decision, and Councilman George Powell also favored a continuance, to which other members of the council agreed.

King, speaking before the last meeting of the Council, said he would see that the premises were kept clean, and that he would see that the tenants were orderly. He has owned the property for a number of years.

Opposition came from the California Southern Oil Company and from Orville A. Clark. The City Planning Commission recently recommended denial of the variance, after receiving six written and two oral protests.


Evening School Will Form New Men's Chorus
