## Tartars Outplay Ingleswood, But Lose Tiff 12-7

Torrance came within three fumbles and five points of slaughtering Ingleswood last Friday night.

In all other phases of the game the locals swamped the Sentinels, but when the final gun had sounded on the Ingleswood field, Torrance found themselves on the short end of a 12-7 count.

Both on the ground and in the air the Tartars spun loops a round Ingleswood. Torrance picked up more than twice as much yardage via the air as did Ingleswood—168 to 81 according to tally sheets.

Ground play led by Co-Captain Boyd Crawford, Ronnie Higgins, Jack Faren, Arnis Dandoy and subs Glyn Boyce and Bobby Yoes in the half back slots netted the Tartars 192 yards against 86 for Ingleswood.

The hometowners picked up a total of 19 first downs while Ingleswood settled for six—five of them in the second half.

Three costly fumbles moved Torrance from the "win" to the "loss" column. Two of the fumbles occurred within the one yard line one of which set up Ingleswood for a TD. The two others simply cost the Tartars a touchdown and their first Bay League win.

Coach Coles' boys seemed to be able to pick up yardage at any time, except when they needed it. The half ended with Torrance on Ingleswood's six yard line, goal to go and four downs in which to do it. Twice from two yards out Jack Faren could not break through with the winning six points.

Ingleswood's first score came early in the first quarter. Torrance took over on the seven yard line where Ingleswood's punt went out of bounds. They pushed it up to the 12-yard marker where Crawford fumbled.

Ingleswood recovered with the nose of the ball hanging over the goal line. Ingleswood's quarterback Joe Clark pushed it over for the tally. A running play for the extra point was checked.

Torrance took the ball and in 12 plays marched down to the Sentinels' one-yard line where they were held for four downs.

On the next series of plays Crawford let go with a pass to Wendel Vaughn who romped 37 yards to the goal for Torrance's single TD.

Ingleswood's second tally came on the fourth play of the second half when Clark heaved a pass over the heads of the Tartar secondary into the arms of rightend Roger Hyduke. The play was good for 55 yards and a touchdown.

The game ended with a near repeat of the Torrance-Ingleswood game of two years ago when the Tartars scored on a pass on the last play of the

## Warriors Nail Third Grid Win

Withstanding a last minute Bakersfield rally, Coach Amby Schneider's El Camino Warriors opened the Metropolitan Conference auspiciously with a 19-18 victory over Bakersfield last Saturday at Sentinel Field, Ingleswood.

The Warrior grid machine coasted to a 13-0 third quarter lead, but had to battle every inch of the way during the last quarter as the Renegades scored fast and furious.

El Camino's victory was its second consecutive win. Riverside fell before the rejuvenated Alondra Park eleven two weeks ago.

After a scoreless initial period, the Camino eleven drew first blood with seven minutes remaining in the half. Bakersfield punted to the Warriors, and on combined runs by Socko Torres, Jim Sears, and Ron Skirloff, the skin was advanced to the Renegade 44. Torres, going off tackle, fumbled, but Larry Oien, Warrior guard, picked up the loose ball and ambled 30 yards to pay dirt. Don Davis' attempted conversion was wide.

El Camino stretched its lead to 13-0 when Paul Held hit Sears with an 18-yard touchdown pass. Sears set up the touchdown when he intercepted a Renegade pass on the Warrior 25 and returned to the 44. Eight plays later El Camino added six points to climax a 56 yard drive. Davis booted the all-important extra point which proved to be the margin of victory.

Bakersfield went to work early in the final stanza and before they were through 12 points were on the Renegade side of

game. Friday night's affair terminated with a thriller that saw Crawford standing on his own 15 yard line, heave a pass to Vaughn. He took it all the way to Ingleswood's 35 yard marker.


