

Strike Threatens Hyperion Project

Unless the steel strike ends and the sand and gravel pits are reopened within the next two weeks, all construction work, involving about \$28 million in contracts at the Hyperion sewage reduction plant will stop.

This was announced last week by Chairman Clarence Derrick of the Board of Public Works.

Claim Capture of Red-headed Video Thief

Torrance detectives yesterday revealed that they had arrested a "redhead second-story man" who admitted to them his part in seven television set thefts in this area. The capture was made here Friday, they said.

The suspect, Howard Hedrick, 28, of Hollywood, was said to have implicated himself with the theft of a set valued at almost \$1000 from the home of George W. Dowdy, 2838 West Sepulveda boulevard on August 14.

Hedrick is now in the Los Angeles County Jail pending an initial hearing on charges of burglary and the sale of stolen property.

Picked up at the same time as Hedrick, was a Highland Park automobile dealer who is charged with working with Hedrick to dispose of the stolen sets.

Torrance Capt. Det. Ernie Ash ton said that Dowdy's stolen set would be returned to him.
