

### TRIM, NEW BUILDINGS NOW OPEN AT AIRPORT

A classy, new \$6500 office, lounge, and rest room addition is now in service at Lomita Flight Strip, where, only a few months ago, it was high impossible even to get a drink of water.

Now, as Manager Ed Dietrich Jr. proudly showed press and visitors alike this week, you can not only drink pure H2O to your heart's content—but also take care of a few other things at the same time.

Airborne passengers and pilots are welcome in the trim knotty pine lounge, where red plush plastic chairs are to be had in abundance. "Coke" comes out of a machine for a nominal fee, and magazines are neatly stacked on nearby tables.

The centrally located, yellow stucco building also houses a new airport office, with adjacent rest rooms.

And more improvements are in store for the field which was a neglected "political" football before the firm of Dietrich and R. J. Collins took over last April 20th.

First on the list is a new taxi strip from the office to the main runway and a paved visitors' parking area, costing totally about \$6000.

Negotiations are also under way for a drive-in cafe at the Pacific Coast highway entrance. The City of Torrance has lent a recent and welcome helping hand at the Pacific Coast highway field by constructing a new entrance road and bringing in a water supply.

### Music Report Heard At TEAC Noon Meeting

Music education in the Torrance schools was the featured topic of discussion at the noon luncheon meeting of the Torrance Educational Advisory Committee held October 12.

The presentation, led by Abe Milstein, music director of the Torrance school system, included brief but interesting reports from four other music instructors, now retained by the school district.

Miss Marilyn Anderson, instructor of instrumental music at Torrance Elementary and Fern Ave. Schools said she had 117 pupils. Throughout the district, there are now 450 pupils studying instrumental music.

Lloyd Reist, music teacher at the Walteria, Seaside, and Perry schools; Harold Dunn, music instructor at Torrance High, and George Zavislan, instructor of choral music at Torrance High, all reported long waiting lists of school children who desired to begin their study of music.

Principal need at present is for musical instruments, Milstein stated. He said the school district now has 100 instruments, but needs three times that number.

It is the policy of the school board to loan musical instruments to beginners, but to encourage parents to purchase instruments for their children as soon as they show interest in continuing their musical education. It was explained by Dr. J. H. Hull, Superintendent of Schools and Milstein.

Outlining the program at Torrance High, Dunn reported that he was directing the organization and instruction of a Tartan band, a high school orchestra; a high school dance band, as well as teaching instrumental music in class work.

Bernard Lee, representative of the Torrance Rotary Club, strongly supported the teaching of music in the schools, endorsing the motto of the school music department, "Better Music for More People."

Parents were informed this week by Dr. George C. Uhl, Los Angeles Health officer, of the ages that children should be immunized.

"There are times when the family doctor will see fit to alter the schedule to suit the needs of the individual youngster, but our list gives the general schedule from infancy upwards," Dr. Uhl said.

Child's Age	Necessary "Shots"
4 Months	Immunize against diphtheria, whooping cough, tetanus and smallpox.
2 Years	Reimmunize against diphtheria, whooping cough, and tetanus.
5 Years	Reimmunize against diphtheria, tetanus, whooping cough, and smallpox.
10 Years	Reimmunize against diphtheria, tetanus and smallpox.
15 years and older	Reimmunize against smallpox every five years.
