## Warrior Powerhouse Stuns Modesto in Opening Frame

Coach Amby Schindler's El Camino Warriors rolled to their fourth victory of the season by overwhelming a hapless Modesto eleven 35-14 Saturday at Ingewood's Sentinel Field.

The Camino grid machine tallied four touchdowns in the first eleven minutes, and coasted the remaining distance with regulars seeing very little action.

Two minutes into the first period found the Alondra Park contingent drawing first blood. A 49 yard pass from Jim Sears to Don Jurk netted the Warrior touchdown. Jack Ray booted his first of five conversions and El Camino led 7-0.

Less than a minute later the Warriors intercepted a Modesto pass and marched 18 yards to paydirt. Fred Springs' interception moved the ball to the Pirate 18 from where "Socks" Torres swept left end for the score. Ray's conversion split the uprights for a 14-0 advantage.

El Camino stretched its lead to 21-0 when Sears climaxed a 31 yard march by going over from the Modesto two. Ray booted the extra point.

With time running out in the opening period Torres raced 64 yards to another El Camino touchdown. Ray once again added the conversion.

Schindler's powerhouse climaxed the scoring for El Camino with a short thrust from the Modesto I. Ron Skirloff carried for the teedee. Stan Gonzales' interception of a Pirate pass paved the way for the score. Ray's kick was good and El Camino led 35-0.

Modesto counted two touchdowns in the second and fourth period on passes from Don Duncan to Ed Heaston and Clarence Allen respectively. Duncan added both conversions.

### Bow and Arrow O.K. For Bear Hunting

California's estimated population of 20,000 bears are legal targets for licensed hunters until December 31, says the Division of Fish and Game.

Adventurous hunters may go after brins with bow and arrow, but most of the expected annual take of approximately 500 animals will be made with high-powered rifles, trapping and lassoing, an old Spanish California custom, are now outlawed.

## COMPTON AFTER NUMBER 'TWENTY ONE' FRIDAY

Compton College continues to stress pass defense this week as they prep for their football battle with the resurgent Vaqueros from Glendale College Friday night. It will be the Tartars attempt for a twenty-first consecutive victory over a three year span.  
It will also mark Compton's effort toward a third straight Western State Conference decision. Tay Brown's Tartars left Ventura in their wake last Friday when they danced through Williams, a 145 pound scabback, stole the show for the Compton team, making two touchdowns with his crowd-pleasing antics. The win was their thirteenth consecutive victory in their home stadium.  
Brown announced that Ray Thornton, defensive left end, will be out with spinal injuries for the rest of the season. Thornton teamed up with tackle Charlie Ane as the sparkplugs of the Compton defensive forward wall. This leaves all-city Leroy Fairman to fill in at Thornton's spot.  
Glendale has not beaten a Compton football team since 1934, and then by a 14-13 count.  
Automatic Bob Moore made all six of his conversions last week giving him a season total of seventeen. This, plus his two touchdowns, ranks him as the top Compton point maker with 29 markers. Dick Bremer, Les Harris, and Carl Williams are all right behind him with four six pointers apiece.

## El Camino College Plan Stadium Dedication Nov. 24

Dedication of El Camino College's new stadium will take place Thanksgiving Day, November 24, with a homecoming celebration and the final football game of the season, according to preliminary plans announced recently by President Forrest G. Murdoch.

Present plans call for combining the football game with a homecoming celebration and an open house program. The newly completed auto shop will be opened for public inspection, along with the new women's gymnasium and field house. Details of the open house program are not yet complete.  
Among the alumni homecoming plans is a dance to be held at the Hermosa Biltmore Hotel on the evening following the football game.
