**School Ceremonies Honor Former Principal Here**

Raymond J. Casey, former principal of Torrance High School, will be installed as director of the Los Angeles Harbor Junior College at impressive 'inauguration' and dedication ceremonies planned for Friday, November 18.

L.A.H.J.C. is a two-year technical institute located on Figueroa street, just off highway 101. The school opened for the first time on September 12, 1949. Dr. Alexander Stoddard, superintendent of the Los Angeles City School System, will deliver the principal address. Director Casey will make a speech of acceptance.

Although a technical institute, L.A.H.J.C. offers to qualified students a limited selection of courses leading to the junior year in a state university or in the state colleges. It is also

planned that as Harbor Junior College expands its facilities, those who seek two years of general and cultural education, without necessarily planning to enter the junior year of a college or university, will have an opportunity to do so.

**Local Graduate Gets GI Course In Omiya, Japan**

Pvt. Gordon P. Robinson, 19, son of Mr. and Mrs. L. E. Phillips, 2016 1/2 Andree avenue, having completed a tour of guard duty at Tokyo Quartermaster Depot at Shinagawa, Japan, has returned to duty at his initial station, Camp King, Omiya, Japan.

During the next few weeks Private Robinson will be given instruction and practical work in range, firing to prepare him for the annual firing meet to be held soon at Camp Palmer, Japan.

Before entering the service Private Robinson was a student at Torrance High School. While in the service he will have the opportunity to continue his education through the Army Education Program.

Private Robinson entered the service in January of this year and received his basic training at Fort Ord, California, and sailed overseas on April 27, 1949. He has indicated that he plans to reenlist upon completing his current enlistment.

**Man Held For Molesting Step-Daughter**

A 36-year-old Torrance switchman was in county jail today after a sheriff's deputy allegedly surprised him in an immoral act with his nine-year-old step-daughter inside a culvert near Lomita boulevard and Vermont avenue.

Deputy D. P. Endom, who trailed the pair to the large drainage tunnel which runs under Lomita boulevard, said that the suspect, Herman C. Malone, 20824 Margaret street, tried to escape before being ordered to halt at gun point.

The deputy reported that he saw Malone and the girl leave a parked sedan on the south side of Lomita boulevard and disappear into the brush. Endom followed.

Caught by surprise in the tunnel, the girl screamed, "We're caught. I want my mother," according to Endom.

Malone started to run through the tunnel when Endom drew his gun and called for the suspect to halt.

When questioned by officers after the arrest, Malone said he took the girl "to look for toys in the tunnel." He was quoted by officers as saying it was the first time he had ever "bothered" the victim.
