
Curtain time is 8 p.m. Following the concert at 9:30 p.m. a dance for the public will be staged in the high school gymnasium.

Relaxed School Money Laws Under Study

Proposed legislation which would permit the Torrance Unified School District to borrow money from its general and building funds to pay off interest and principal due on outstanding bonds is to be given careful study by the county council's office, the County Board of Supervisors has indicated.

The suggested bill, expected to be presented at the next session of the state legislature, would make it possible for school districts to draw from these funds in the event they should be "temporarily embarrassed" on the due date of bond payments.

Under present laws, school districts, even though solvent, cannot borrow such funds to meet emergencies, according to Supervisor Raymond V. Darby.

Blames Job Loss on Union, Files Claim With NLRB

Weaver H. Jones, 1318 W. 221st street, recently claimed that his discharge from a plastering job in a Wilmington apartment house was brought about by threats of AFL union agents against his employer. Jones made the claim in formal charges filed against the unions with the National Labor Relations Board.

Jones, who contends that he has applied for union membership but has been denied entry, AFL, carpenter, told him that

business agents threatened to pressure the Los Angeles Fire Department into suspending Golden if Jones continued on the job.

The union business agents, Jones charged, also threatened to have the father expelled from the carpenters union, put the apartment house on the union list, and to fine an A. F. of L. union man who ever rented one of the apartments.
