### Judge Upholds Legality of Local Ordinance

Distribution of handbills of a political or religious nature is not in violation of a city ordinance, nor is the same ordinance unconstitutional.

This was the ruling handed down by City Judge Otto B. Willett Monday afternoon as he sustained a demurrer filed by the attorney for Delphine Smith, 1410 Annapolis avenue and Nottis Baker, of San Pedro. The women had been charged by City Attorney C. Douglass Smith with the violation of city ordinance No. 331 which makes it illegal to distribute handbills within the city.

In a brief prepared by Sam Major, attorney for the defendants, it was admitted that the handbills distributed by the women on October 13 contained advertising for the Communist

Party of America. The brief argued the constitutionality of an ordinance which restricted the dissemination of political advertising.

Speaking before a sparsely populated courtroom, City Attorney Smith declared that his case was not based upon "an attack on any political party." If a group wants to distribute leaflets they are required by law to apply for a license, he said.

However, Judge Willett declared that the local ordinance was drawn up to prevent "outside business firms from flooding the area with advertising literature; not to restrict 'non-commercial' advertisers. In this interpretation, the ordinance is not unconstitutional, the judge said.

The court agreed to allow Attorney Smith ten days in which to file an amended brief. The case will be heard and argued again on December 1.

### Starts Air Training

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### Miss Margot Bumpus in Another Crack at L. A. Police

Accused by Los Angeles police of robbery and held up to ridicule as the "Blonde Bandit," Miss Margot Bumpus, 19, legal secretary who lives at 1001 West 190th street, filed her third amended complaint for \$75,000 damages against Police Chief Worton in Superior Court Monday.

Last July 1, Miss Bumpus said through her attorney father, G. M. Bumpus, that seven police officers seized her and shoved her into their police car.

On the way to Lincoln Heights Jail, she said, they chided and ridiculed her, forced her to sleep in evil-smelling quarters with insufficient covering. All this done maliciously to harass and annoy her, the girl said.

Her crowning humiliation, the complaint said, and one which gave her nervous tremors and shock was to learn the newspapers had stated she was suspected of being the "Blonde Bandit." This undeserved notoriety, the girl contended, and the
