

### THREE COPS HURT IN FOOTBALL GAME RIOT

Flying pop bottles, stones, and fruit punctuated the closing strains of the "alma mater" Friday afternoon after the Narbonne High School football team had defeated San Pedro at Daniels Field.

It took 30 police officers about 45 minutes to quell a riot among the rooters after an unidentified fan hit a police officer with a rock as the officer was trying to disperse the throng which was milling about in the street.

Three officers were injured and two San Pedro youths were arrested and jailed as an aftermath of the fracas following the final Eastern Marine League game of the season.

Booked at the San Pedro jail were Frank Herrera, 20, on charges of resisting an officer, and Don Holbert, 18, charged with suspicion of assault with a deadly weapon.

Police Officers Warren H. Bressler and William Tretter were treated at San Pedro emergency hospital for cuts and bruises. Police Sgt. D. E. Jones, struck with a rock, was not hospitalized.

Tretter was slugged on the back of the neck with a bottle and was punched in the nose by one of the crowd. Bressler received face cuts when he was hit by a rock.




