### 300 STUDENTS TO SING IN CHRISTMAS CONCERT

Seven organizations, including glee clubs and choirs, directed by George Zavislan, instrumental ensembles under the direction of Harold Dunn, in which more than 300 students participate, will present the Third Annual Christmas Concert and Songfest on Thursday evening December 15 at 8:15 in the Torrance High School Auditorium.

Dressed in black and white, the 300 carolers carrying lighted candles and singing the Westminster Carol, and "Angels We Have Heard on High," will usher in the varied program. There will be string ensembles, a vocal madrigal, quartets, duets and solos.

Pianists who will serve as accompanists will be Anita Menni, Janet Poh, Mickey Vandevanter, Carol Campbell and Mary Lou Hutchinson.

The highlight of the concert is "The Music of Bethlehem" a sacred cantata by Fred B. Holt, sung by the mixed chorus with orchestra accompaniment.

"However, this annex will handle only parcel post. All other post office business will be handled at the main post office on Marcelina avenue. The annex will remain open from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.," informed the postmaster.

"Residents with Christmas packages to be mailed can save themselves a lot of waiting-in-line by mailing packages between 8:10 a.m. and 1:30-3:30 p.m. Our mail lines are jammed during the noon hour by persons who can only get to the post office during their lunch hour."

To insure delivery of Yuletide presents by Christmas, packages should be mailed by Saturday, December 10, acting-postmaster Deiningger warned yesterday.

Air Parcel Post service may be used for packages not ready for mailing by Saturday.


"It would help greatly," he

declares, "if people would decide exactly what they want before they approach the windows—how much insurance on a package, whether they want it registered, and how many stamps they need."

"Remember that parcels may not be sealed unless they bear a printed label authorizing opening for postal inspection if necessary. Use corrugated cardboard, heavy outer paper, and strong cord in wrapping. The post office has to move millions of packages within the next few weeks, and they should be able to withstand normally vigorous handling."

"Please don't snap at a clerk if he advises you to rewrap a gift. He's helping you make sure it arrives in first-class condition. I've seen packages brought in that are about as sturdy as a lemon meringue pie wrapped in tissue paper."

When you're finished using a post office pen, don't slam it down and bend the point, Deiningger requests. "Naturally, they scratch a little. Each pen is used by an average of 200 people a day. We put in all new pen points a few days ago, and by Christmas we'll have to replace them all."
