Reports of the damage following the wake of a typhoon in Guam which raged at 110 miles an hour about two weeks ago, were received here this week in a letter from Mrs. Joe A. Miller by Mrs. Charles Ingham, 1864 Pacific Coast highway.

Chief Joe A. Miller, U.S. Navy, was joined by his wife and three sons of Lomita several months ago when they sailed for Guam. Since residing there Mrs. Miller became manager of the U. S. Navy-operated beauty shop but when the typhoon struck she found herself suddenly without employment for the wind took the entire front of the building which housed the beauty shop. She also stated that the family had to join others in a public shelter during the storm.

Mrs. Miller felt that they would be back in Lomita for Christmas when she went to Guam but now she writes that Chief Miller has decided to remain with the Navy for another four years and will be stationed there.

Gifts were arranged beneath the big bird who is credited with bringing the precious bundles and tiny blue diaper-shaped nut cups, added to the decorations.


