### Aid Cancer Research

Two Californians—a brilliant young scientist and an attractive laboratory technician—have discovered one of the most important aids to cancer research and treatment to be developed in decades.

Dr. Philip West and Mrs. Jessie Hilliard of the School of Medicine of the University of California at Los Angeles have found a much-needed method to predict the possible course of the disease, says the Woman's Home Companion in an article "Latest Weapon Against Cancer."

"This miraculous new detector promises to double the effectiveness of treatment, make diagnosis surer and open new doorways to research," says the article.

It is not a cure for cancer, reports the magazine, but it is a method of determining concisely and quickly exactly what the condition of the sufferer is. Never before has this been possible. Cancer treatment, up to now, has been largely a process of prayer and hope.

Dr. West and Mrs. Hilliard have been working with the support of Dr. Stafford Warren, dean of UCLA Medical School, and Dr. Ernest Edwards, head of Birmingham Veterans Hospital at Van Nuys. Their work was carried out with funds provided by the California Institute for Cancer.
