DONALD J. HITCHCOCK JOINS JUDGE WILLETT

Donald J. Hitchcock, former Student Body President at Tor-High School and UCLA, and recently a successful candidate for admittance to the California State Bar, has joined Judge Otto B. Willett in the latter's law office in Torrance.

Hitchcock who passed the October bar examination after graduating from the USC School of Law is the son of James E. Hitchcock, former Torrance City Councilman for 14 years.

The new lawyer is married to Jean Hitchcock whom he met while attending UCLA. He was president of the Associated Student Body during his junior year. After graduating from the Westwood campus he enrolled in the Law School at USC.

The couple now live in Manhattan Beach where Mrs. Hitchcock teaches school.

Judge Willett is currently sitting on the Bench of the Long Beach Municipal Court, Division One by reassignment from State Supreme Court Justice Phil S. Gipson, chairman of the Judicial Council. Judge Willett has been magistrate of the Torrance City Court since 1942.

Hitchcock's sister, Mrs. Kenneth Dudley lives at 1507 Greenwood avenue.

Liquor License of Beach Club To Be Reviewed

The on-sale liquor license of the Hollywood Riviera Beach Club, suspended on January 3, can not possibly be reinstated before January 26, a Board of Equalization spokesman said yesterday.

Ed. Clark of the Los Angeles office of the State Board said that the license, originally issued to Graham E. Harris, could not be reissued until the next meeting of the board which is scheduled to meet in Los Angeles the latter part of January. The liquor official said the license for the club, scene of many dinner-dance affairs, was officially suspended on the third

of January after board action taken on November 21. Failure to obtain a second license for a cocktail bar located in another room other than that for which the original permit was granted was given as the reason for suspending the on-sale license, the board official stated.
