Rancho Car Fire Victim Critical From Many Burns


Burned over more than 60 per cent of her body, a teenage girl lies near death today following a fiery crash last Thursday in Seaside Ranchos. The girl, 18-year-old Dolores Logan, of 2985 Benita avenue, Redondo Beach, was pulled by her hair screaming and kicking as rescuers braved gas-line flames to yank the girl through a window of the overturned auto. A plea for blood donors of any type was issued by attendants at the Harbor General Hospital who said the girl had received second and third degree burns about the face, neck, arms, and lower extremities of her body. The crash occurred, according to accident reports of Torrance Police officers "D. C. Cook and Ted Morris, when an auto driven by Earl D. Graves, 26, of Hollywood bounced off a bank on Carol Drive, skidded, overturned and caught fire when gasoline, spilled on the hot engine burst into flames, Graves said. Mrs. O. C. Wolfe, an eye wit-

ness to the accident, said she was terrified as she heard the screams of the trapped girl coming from the flaming auto. Graves, recounting the accident to investigating officers, said: "We flopped over on our side. I tried to get out of the door on her side, since mine was against the pavement. Dolores was shocked I guess and I couldn't get her to help. Then the flames started coming through and she got panicky. I couldn't get the door open because it was jammed so I crawled around into the back seat. "I grabbed her the only way I could, which was by the hair and dragged her after me. The flames were filling the inside. I tried shoving her through the door but she was screaming and kicking and I just couldn't do it. I climbed through the window and tried pulling her out. That was when somebody jumped up on the side of the car and helped pull her out of the window."
