The new dressmaking class under Bessie Louise Marsh will start Monday night, February 20, from 6:30-9:30 in room 201, Torrance High School. The class will feature the operation of the sewing machine, the making of coats, dresses, and children's clothes. Students are invited to bring their own material so that the teacher can give individual instruction in making the finished garment. There is no charge for this class or for the use of any of the sewing machines.

The interior decorating class now forming is open to students who are interested in furnishing a new home or redesigning an old one. Subjects discussed will be: How to arrange furniture in your home, how to use color to advantage, how to select and buy furniture, how to create a happy family life through the use of good appointments and orderliness of design in your home.

The interior decorating class, conducted by Gheratine Pinniger, who has traveled extensively in Central and South America, brings to those attending world-wide, inexpensive, down-to-earth ideas for the furnishing of simple Southern California homes.

A new night class in lampshade-making held each Wednesday night at 6:30 in room 301, shows the students how to make expensive lampshades inexpensively. Students are shown how different types of lamps go with different rooms and different types of furnishings. They are shown how to select material and make the finished product. Special emphasis is placed on cutting costs and building up glamor and charm in the home.

\$100 CHECK DONATED TO DIMES CAMPAIGN

Prompted by a news story that Torrance was lagging in its support of the March of Dimes campaign, the Torrance Junior Woman's Club this week donated \$100 to the drive.

"When we learned through a newspaper story carried in the Torrance Herald that our city was far behind the goal—so far behind that we had not subscribed enough to care for the polio victims who were stricken in our own community last year, we decided to do something about it," said Mrs. Philip Jensen, president of the club.

"We hope that our action will set a precedent that other clubs and organizations in the community will follow," she commented.

The \$100 donated to the campaign is in addition to the donation the group will give to the California Federation of Women's Clubs for the purchase of an iron lung for the district. Among the other philanthropic activities carried on by the local women's group is the building of a fund to finance the construction of a YWCA building in Torrance. The annual Torrance Queen contest is sponsored by the Junior Woman's Club as a means of adding to the YWCA building fund.

Mothers of three of the six Torrance polio victims last year were members of the Junior Woman's Club.
